4. A description of all documents, objects, substances or things seized, taken or removed from the person of the defendant by law enforcement officers or at their behest, and the present location of the aforesaid items.
5. Copies of all written statements and/or the substance of all oral statements received as a result of interrogation with the defendant by officers of the law.
6. Copies of all search warrants and affidavits for search warrants issued in this cause.
7. Copies of all waivers of rights allegedly executed by the defendant in this cause.
8. The names, addresses, and occupations of all persons who will testify on behalf of the State of Arkansas upon trial of this cause.

9. The results of any scientific examinations or tests which were conducted in connection with the alleged incident including, but not limited to, medical, blood, breath, chemical, botanical, ballistics, handwriting or polygraph tests, examinations or analyses.

10. A description of all evidence including, but not limited to, written statements and tangible objects which will be relied upon by the State of Arkansas upon trial of this cause.

During arraignment proceedings, the Court informed the accused that he has the following rights:

Representation by an attorney, provided for him at no cost if he cannot afford one.

2. To a copy of the information filed against him, and knowledge that he is charged with a felony punishable by 30 yrs to LIFE.
3. To make bond in the amount of \$ 50,000.00.
4. To trial by jury.
5. To know the names of the state's witnesses against him and cross-examine them.
6. To summons witnesses in his own behalf and compel their attendance at his trial.
7. To be presumed innocent until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt--that burden being on the state.
8. To remain silent and know that anything he says can be used against him.
9. To appeal a conviction, with a free transcript provided if he cannot afford one.
10. To know that if he chooses to plead guilty, he loses his right to appeal. The judge's verdict is final and cannot be withdrawn for a jury trial.

The Court then asked the accused the following questions:

1. Do you understand the terms that have been used here?
2. Are you under any medication or psychiatric care?
3. Has anyone abused, threatened, or coerced you?

I, attorney for the accused, believe he is capable of understanding his rights and the substance of this proceeding.

Comes now the defendant, Thomas Alfred Taylor, and upon all the files, records and proceedings heretofore had herein, respectfully moves the Court for an Order dismissing this action on the following grounds:

1. The facts brought forth at the probable cause determination are not sufficient to allow a neutral and detached judge to find probable cause that a crime was committed within the jurisdiction of the Circuit Court of Washington County, or that this defendant did commit said crime;

2. The presentation by the state of an affidavit by an investigator for the Prosecuting Attorney at the probable cause hearing is not sufficient to establish probable cause under the laws of the state of Arkansas, e.g., Ark. Stat. Ann. §43-601, §43-603, Graves v. State, 256 Ark. 117 505 S.W.2d 748 (1974), and the United States, e.g., Coleman v. Alabama, 399 U.S. 1 (1970) and Gerstein v. Pugh, 95 S.Ct. 854 (1975).

MOTION TO MODIFY BAIL

Comes now the defendant, Thomas Alfred Taylor, and moves the Court for an Order modifying the bail as previously set in the above-captioned action to an amount that would insure the appearance of the defendant at future proceedings and that will not require the incarceration of the defendant prior to trial.

In the alternative, Mr. Taylor moves the Court for an Order that he be allowed to resume his job, returning to custody at the end of each work day.

1. Mr. Taylor's incarceration is working a severe economic hardship on him and on those who look to him for financial support. It is preventing his active participation in the preparation of his defense and payment of fees to his attorney.

2. Continued incarceration of Mr. Taylor because of his indigency violates his rights to Equal Protection of the Laws, to Bail, to be free from Excessive Bail and Habeas Corpus under Sections 3, 8, 9 and 11 respectively of Article 2 of the Arkansas Constitution, and the Habeas Corpus Clause, Eighth Amendment and the Equal Protection and Due Process Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment of the United States Constitution.

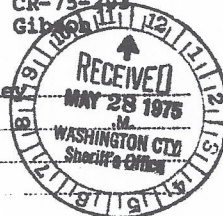





The Court further finds as to paragraph 2 of the Motion for Discovery and Inspection that Defendant's request for inspection is granted but his request for independent testing of any objects is granted only if the Plaintiff and Defendant agree to a plan for the transfer of custody of any such objects that does not interrupt the plaintiff's claim of custody over said objects.

Comes now the plaintiff herein, State of Arkansas, by Mahlon G. Gibson, Prosecuting Attorney, and in response to the Motion for Bill of Particulars and Motion for Discovery and Inspection filed by the defendant herein, states and alleges as follows:

(1) That to the best knowledge of the State, the alleged acts set forth in the Information filed herein occurred on May 10, 1975, at approximately 4:00 a.m., between Fayetteville and Springdale, Arkansas, in the area of Highway 265 and Zion Road.

(2) That the crime charged in the Information occurred as set forth in said Information filed herein.

(3) That to the best knowledge of the State, the following persons were present or observing the alleged acts set forth by the Information filed herein:

(a) The defendant herein.

(b) [REDACTED], [REDACTED] Springdale, Arkansas.

(c) Michael Elzey, 1764 North Leverett Street, Fayetteville, Arkansas.

(d) Michael Huddleston, 207 East Sunset, Springdale, Arkansas.
